We arrived back on January 11 to the usual chaos of rampant summer growth and no gardening!

We have good crops of black and green beans, corn, squash, tomatoes, silverbeet, radish, beetroot, courgettes and lettuce. The garlic harvest was disappointing this year for some reason. We have our first few passionfruit and cooking apples. The plums and strawberries are finished. The new herb spiral is flourishing.

We have some beautiful sunflowers, both red and yellow. We have a lovely show of gerberas, alstroemerias and sweet peas.

Hamilton City Council now charges us to lease the garden and with no funding for the gardening (apart from the coordinator's wages) it is a bit of a struggle to meet the costs of resources, plants and the cost of the weed bins.

On the up side, Council removed the large phoenix palm from the garden. Thank you to the guys for their great job with

this. Although impressive looking, the palm has many disadvantages: the roots absorb all the moisture for quite a distance from the tree meaning the fruit trees along the front have really been struggling to grow, the fronds are very sharp and, along with seed pods, dropped a lot of mess in the pond and around areas.

These palms are now considered noxious and this one housed hundreds of pigeons.

We are looking forward to a growth spurt in the fruit trees. A little research revealed that palms can turn into valuable mulch with a little patience and time, the huge pile of roots and branches is already composting down nicely.

We try to turn what is normally expensive waste into resources as much as possible.

We are also looking at extending the depth of the pond and creating a little wetland ecosystem which will also benefit from the removal of the palm.
