NOW that autumn has nearly completed its resting

is nearly complete, you will be clearing the garden. Don't put any diseased plants in your compost.

It's time to think ahead regarding winter crops. It is now time to plant root crops such as carrots, radishes, beetroot, swede, onions and leeks. They don't do well in soil that has been composted in the past year.

If you think the pesky white butterfly has finally left your garden, it may be time to plant brassicas as the weather cools - broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower and brussel sprouts.

Legume crops can also be planted - broad beans, snow peas, green manure crops such as lupins, alfalfa and mustard. Green manure crops are a natural fertiliser and provide nitrogen for the general health of your garden. Green manure crops also add humus when the plants are dug into the soil before they flower.
